




















Building Construction


- Materials Immediately available?
- Must be cheap and plentiful
- Cant require sophisticated manufacture
- Locally sourced











Why is Asbestos so much in NZ consciousness





Exposure to asbestos the single biggest cause of workrelated disease mortality in New Zealand

- <u>UK data</u>
- 2,542 mesothelioma deaths in 2015
- 467 Asbestosis deaths in 2015
- 24.6M employed in 1986

- <u>New Zealand data</u>
- In 2010: about 170
 asbestos related deaths
 out of 600 900 work
 related deaths
- 1.6M in Employment
 1986





Final Thoughts



- Acceptable Risk 1: 100,000
- Exposure = Risk
 - Concentration
 - Duration
- No threshold
- Even very small exposures provide some (very small) risk



Final Thoughts

Background Exposure

10,000's properties in Auckland contain some asbestos

- 100's uncontrolled demolitions (Significant regulatory issues)
- ACM currently in satisfactory condition but some fibre will be released
 - High levels of replacement in future years
- Fibre doesn't deteriorate in the environment ACM deteriorates to fibre
- Potential to increase existing very low background levels ?
- What happens if we double background levels
 - 10x exposure <u>f/ml.yr</u> 6x risk estimate
 - general population exposure $-\underline{1.5M}$ (2.5M by 2028)
